## Classic Chicken Pot Pie

- 1 box (14.1 oz) refrigerated Pillsbury Pie Crust (2 count), softened as directed on box
- 1/2 cup butter or margarine
- 1/3 cup chopped onion
- 1/3 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/4 tsp pepper
- 1-3/4 cups chicken broth
- 1/2 cup milk
- 2-1/2 cups shredded cooked chicken
- 2 cups frozen mixed vegetables, thawed
- Heat oven to 425°F. Prepare pie crust as directed on box for Two-Crust Pie using 9-inch glass pie pan
- In 2-quart saucepan, melt butter over medium heat. Add onion; cook 2 minutes, stirring frequently, until tender. Stir in flour, salt and pepper until well blended. Gradually stir in broth and milk, cooking and stirring until bubbly and thickened.
- 3. Stir in chicken and mixed vegetables. Remove from heat. Spoon chicken mixture into crust-lined pan. Top with second crust; seal edge and flute. Cut slits in several places in top crust.
- 4. Bake 30 to 40 minutes or until crust us golden brown. During last 15-20 minutes of baking, cover crust edge with foil strips to prevent excessive browning. Let stand 5

minutes before serving
