

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK...

Grace and peace to you all!

Walmsley Blvd UMC is now having two types of transition. I will be leaving, while the new pastor will be coming in. The new pastor's first Sunday in the pulpit will be on July 2nd, 2023. Walmsley is now experiencing the pastoral leadership transition and I ask all church members to be one in praying for the new pastor. Welcoming is much more important than goodbye: The former is for the present and future, while the latter is for the past. I give thanks to you all for your love, prayers, and support during the past two years. I believe that all of the Walmsley congregation will give the same thing to the new pastor. I will be very happy if I hear good sounds that Walmsley people make with the new pastor. Therefore, prepare yourself to greet and welcome your new pastor.

Here is another transition that Walmsley Blvd UMC is experiencing. It is to revitalize the church. It is related to the church's recent financial condition. Church leadership and I decided to request our Bishop to send a part-time pastor rather than a full-time pastor to Walmsley Blvd UMC. To be honest, it was a very difficult decision. However, church leaders and I had discussed, prayed, and discerned for a long time until arriving at the decision. We believe that it surely can be the best way for Walmsley Blvd UMC and its sustainable present and future. Therefore, I gently ask all of the Walmsley congregation to be ONE in Jesus Christ and ONE in church mission and ministry. The Walmsley congregation must be much more vital and grow not just in finance but in all church ministry areas such as worship attendance, Sunday School, Bible study, local and global mission, etc. To make the church vital and growing, all people of Walmsley must be ONE. In the mindset of open heart, open mind, and open door, all people must collect ideas, prayers, and actions, and all people must invite and bring people to the church. For this revitalization of the church, prepare yourself to go, meet, invite, and welcome whoever. And, trust God. Trust your church leadership and support them, and cooperate with them always.

Friends, I am very thankful that I have been your pastor here at Walmsley Blvd UMC. I came here in July 2021, had open-heart surgery in September 2021 and stayed away from the pulpit for two months for recovery.

Honestly, it has been very difficult to discern what symptoms could be ignored or what symptoms have to be checked by medical professionals. I am not a medical doctor or cardiologist. By knowing my limitations, what I can do is that I put myself in the hands of doctors in a hospital. In similarity, like this, we all need a doctor for our spiritual health, especially. It is a reason that a pastor is called a doctor of the soul. During the ministry here and leaving here now, I often ask myself, "Am I a useful doctor for the souls of the Walmsley people?" Of course, I grant that I have not been perfect. Therefore, Walmsley people, I ask your grace for my imperfection, mistakes, wrongdoings, etc. These should be leaving with me. Instead, please keep good memories continually. God loves you all. Thank you and thank you. Amen.

# MEET THE NEW PASTOR-REV. RICARDO HAYNES!

Born and raised in Spanish Town, Jamaica, Ricardo Anthony Haynes' preparation for the Christian ministry has been shaped by life experience and formal academic training. He has been active in ministry since the age of fifteen. Growing up in an impoverished and violent community, the church became his bedrock and place of refuge. His mother instilled in him and his brother the importance of education as a means of overcoming poverty. Over the years, Rev. Haynes has served the church and the theological academic community in various capacities. Within the church he served as Sunday School

Superintendent, Youth Leader, Bible Study Teacher, and Associate Minister. He has also served as an Instructor at the Jamaica Theological Seminary and the Samuel DeWitt Proctor School of Theology, Virginia Union University.

Rev. Haynes would describe himself as a hard worker and life-long learner, who is inspired to live, serve and share the passion of Christ. He has a Bachelor of Arts degree in Business Administration and three Master degrees --- a Master of Arts degree in Interdisciplinary Studies with honors from the Caribbean Graduate School of Theology, a Master of Divinity degree from the Samuel DeWitt Proctor School of Theology, Virginia Union University, and a Master of Theology degree in Systematic Theology from Candler School of Theology, Emory University.

He is the former pastor of Mt. Zion Baptist Church in Bumpass, VA. Rev. Haynes provided transformational servant leadership to the benefit of the church.

In addition to his commitment to the church, Rev. Haynes is a passionate activist for social and racial justice. His commitment to the fight against racism has led him to partner with the Virginia Center for Inclusive Communities to foster healing and bridge the racial divide. His favorite scripture is Micah 6:8 (ESV), "He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?"

## **Chicken & Wild Rice Casserole**

- 1 (2.25oz) packages sliced almonds, toasted
- 2 (6.2oz) boxes fast-cooking long-grain and wild rice mix
- 1/4 cup butter
- 4 celery ribs, chopped
- 2 medium onion, chopped
- 5 cups chopped cooked chicken
- 2 (10-3/2oz) cans cream of mushroom soup
- 2 (8oz) cans chopped water chestnuts, drained
- 1 (8oz) container sour cream
- 1 cup milk
- 1/2 tsp. table salt
- 1/2 tsp freshly ground pepper
- 4 cups (16oz) shredded Cheddar cheese, divided
- 2 cups soft, fresh breadcrumbs



- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F. Bake almonds in a single layer in a shallow pan 4-6 mins or until toasted and fragrant, stirring halfway through.
- 2. Prepare rice mixes according to package directions.
- 3. Meanwhile, melt butter in a large skillet over medium heat; add celery and onions. Sauté 10 mins or until tender. Stir in chicken, next 6 ingredients, rice, and 3 cups of cheese. Spoon mixture into light greased 15X10 in baking dish or 2 (11X7in) baking dishes. Top with breadcrumbs.
- 4. Bake at 350°F for 35 minutes. Sprinkle with remaining 1 cup cheese, and top with toasted almonds. Bake 5 minutes.

What Makes Us Feel Good?



Researchers say that people who give their money and time to others are happier than those who don't. While giving can make us happy, I wonder if happiness should be our goal. Giving can make us feel good, but there are difficult situations that require our support.

In I Chronicles 29:1-5, King David invited the Israelites to donate. Verses 6-8 tell us the people gave joyously, but it is important to realize why they gave. Verse 9 says, "They gave freely and wholeheartedly to the Lord." The Israelites gave gold, silver and precious stones. I Chronicles 29 shows King David passing the throne on to Solomon. David's life was marked by conflict, but Solomon, whose name means "peace," would have a different kind of rule. The "golden age" of Solomon would see Israel attain prosperity and influence. Solomon's reign was marked by large building projects, including the temple and his palace.

Scripture never tells us to give because it will make us happy but to give willingly to meet a need. When we give to meet a need, joy often follows. Raising money for evangelism can often be easier than for administration. We are called to be generous towards the needs of others. Jesus freely gave himself to meet our needs. (II Corinthians 8:9)

Prayer – Thank you God for the "joy" found in giving. Give me a generous heart toward all needs, especially ordinary needs. Amen!

<u>I Chronicles 29:9 – "The people rejoiced at the willing response of their leaders,</u> for they had given freely and wholeheartedly to the Lord."
